
We invite our guests to come again and worship with us again. You are always welcome here in God's house!

Our Holy Communion Practice

Dear visitors and guests: You may be relieved to know that we do not want to impose our practice of Holy Communion on you. In fact, God's Word teaches that Communion is intended only for those who have been taught the Biblical truths and meaning of the Sacrament, and for those who have previously expressed their doctrinal unity (communion...common-union) with the congregation. This is what is meant by the scriptural practice of "close communion."

It wasn't too long ago that most Lutheran church bodies held to this practice, but now many have now abandoned it in the age of political correctness. We still appreciate it and retain it, and extend fellowship at the Lord's Table to the communicant members of our Wisconsin Synod and also those of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS), with whom we are presently in doctrinal fellowship. If, as our guest today, you have not had the opportunity to explore or express your fellowship with us, please observe our Communion service today, and speak with our pastor later if you have questions. We'd be happy to spend time over an open Bible and explain why we do what we do as we try to faithfully follow Scripture.




The Order of Worship Based on CW, p. 15 "The Common Service"

P: We begin our worship in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.




- P: Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.
- ALL: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.



P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.



P: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord!

The Second Lesson Mark 4:26-34

The growth and strengthening of God's kingdom lies completely in God's hands. Certainly, you and I are commanded to faithfully share the Word, but it is GOD who uses that Word to accomplish His will.

²⁶ He also said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. ²⁷ Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. ²⁸ All by itself the soil produces grain—first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. ²⁹ As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."

³⁰ Again he said, "What shall we say the kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it? ³¹ It is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds on earth. ³² Yet when planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all garden plants, with such big branches that the birds can perch in its shade."

³³ With many similar parables Jesus spoke the word to them, as much as they could understand. ³⁴ He did not say anything to them without using a parable. But when he was alone with his own disciples, he explained everything.


The Nicene Creed


We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Be a Happy Camper for the Lord

- 1) Don't grumble or complain
- 2) Focus on the future glory
 - 3) Serve the Lord

⁶ Therefore we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. ⁷ For we live by faith, not by sight. ⁸ We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹ So we make it our goal to please him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. ¹⁰ For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each of us may receive what is due us for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.

¹ For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. ² Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling, ³ because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked. ⁴ For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. ⁵ Now the one who has fashioned us for this very purpose is God, who has given us the Spirit as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come.


The Offering






P: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.




Jesus' Words Instituting His Holy Supper

The Distribution





Announcements – June 19/20, 2021

- 1) As another part of our return to some previous happenings and service, the "Greeter Program" is re-starting. - 2) The **Annual Congregational Budget Meeting** will take place on Tuesday, June 22, 6:00 PM in the church basement. Any and all members are encouraged to attend. When it's time for any final decision, the voters will take up that responsibility.
- 3) **Madison County Fair** Sunday, July 11, **9:30 AM**, is the date for our service down in Madison. There'll still be the regular Saturday evening worship service here on July 10, but would be awesome to have as many as possible down in Madison!!
- 4) **Sunday Bible Class** There will be NO Bible Class today (6/20). The plan is to go through the 3rd Article on Sunday, June 28, and then pause the class for the month of July. The Fellowship Group is providing goodies this morning for enjoying each others' company, but no formal class.
- 5) A **General Motors vehicle key & FOB** were found this last Sunday in the grass on the east side of school after our outdoor service. No one claimed it then, so the thought is someone lost it prior to this last Sunday?? Call to the church office (371-1233) if you think it's yours.
- 6) **Camp Messiah 2021** After last summer's hiatus, Camp Messiah is back up and running! This year's version is Sunday August 1 Wednesday, August 4, to be held once again at Camp Calvin Crest, just south across the river from Fremont.
 - Students entering Grades 5-9 are eligible as "campers." Students in high school (sophomores, juniors, seniors) and college are welcome to attend Camp Messiah as "Junior Counselors." Information letters and registration forms are available at the Communication Center. All campers and junior counselors must complete an application and send in the appropriate registration fee. Application and fees are due by Wednesday, June 30.
- 7) Some more gradual steps will be taken to re-implement past church regular functions...greeters, Communion registration, and hymnals to name a few. Also as part of this process, more ribbons have been removed from pews. The east section of pews will still be set aside for a while.
